



STORM ÉOWYN AND LEARNING FROM OUR HORSES



A number of participants were on the yard at the time but our fantastic practitioners quickly took control of the situation and moved the participants into the tack room, our safest building, whilst the equine team stayed with the horses to ensure their safety. Toro, Hannah's Lusitono x gelding who can be anxious to loud noises due to past traumatic experiences, was the most affected and became very agitated, leaping around his pen and trying to jump out. However, with calm handling he was able to manage his anxiety to be lead out of the yard where he stood calmly on the track staying within sight of the other horses with his tail to the storm. The other horses chose to stand together in the big open barn seemingly unaffected by the deafening hail on the roof, and remaining amazingly calm in spite of the extremely frightening weather event.







Giving a beautiful demonstration of animal and humans supporting each other, Elsie our lurcher dog who was really frightened by the thunder chose to go straight to one of our participants who was also very scared. Elsie stuck to his side whilst the participant comforted her, helping him stay calm himself, which was beautiful to witness. After the storm had passed we noticed how the horses spent time rolling and resting together later that afternoon, to shake off the experience and recover. During our debriefing as a team afterwards we discussed what amazing role models horses can be, demonstrating their resilience and capacity to 'weather the storm' and knowing what they needed to do to recover.



COMMUNITY EVENTS



We have had a busy spring with a number of events. In February we were delighted to welcome the leader of the Liberal Democrat party Ed Davey together with our local MP Caroline Voaden to visit Sirona. Ed and Caroline were really interested in our work and to learn about the power of horses to change vulnerable young people's lives. We also talked about the complexities and difficulty in funding the work we do, with disparities in the funding system for young people who are care experienced or adopted, with Caroline saying she will be sure to feed this back to parliament.

Later in the month we hosted our popular information morning for people interested in learning more about our work or how our referral process works, and also ran a course for our team on Foetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder which affects many young people referred to Sirona.

Then in March we were honoured to be invited to a black tie dinner and fundraising auction at HMS Drake in Plymouth hosted by The High Sherriff of Devon, Jake Moores OBE who chose Sirona as one of his charities of the year in 2024–25. We are very grateful to Jake for fundraising £1500 for Sirona and for presenting us with a High Sherriff Award for Community Services.

Finally, Hannah and Diane attended a really informative course on improving grass management for horses and the environment run by Equiculture www.equiculture.net/the-equicentral-system. We highly recommend this course, and it was heartening to see that we are already practicing many of their recommendations with our open barn system, rotating, seeding and mulching paddocks, and also to learn what more we can work towards doing.
